## Joel L. Lockhart Director of Logistics

Joel L. Lockhart is the director of Logistics for the Defense Commissary Agency, headquartered at Fort Lee, Virginia, a position he has held since March 12, 2023.

As the agency's Logistics director, Mr. Lockhart oversees the operations and business processes of 8 overseas Central Distribution Centers (CDC), the Central Meat Processing Plant (CMPP) in Europe, management and accountability for operational equipment and supplies, and the agency's distribution and transportation operations supporting nearly 240 commissaries in 13 countries, and 780 dedicated employees.

Mr. Lockhart has more than 33 years of combined military and civil service. Prior to his current assignment, he had served since September 2017 as senior supply management specialist in the Acquisition Logistics Policy and Programs Directorate, Office of the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Army for Sustainment, ASA (ALT). There he was responsible for advising the ASA (ALT) leadership on strategies and resources necessary to execute supply management and property accountability policies, processes, and procedures.

From 2016 to 2017, Mr. Lockhart served as the as a contractor in support of the Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, G-4, Logistics Innovation Agency, and the Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Army for Financial Management and Comptroller. Before his contracting assignment, he served in the civil service as the chief of the Logistics Enterprise Systems Division at the Combined Arms Support Command from January to July 2016.

Before retiring from the U.S. Army in 2015 as a chief warrant officer five, Mr. Lockhart served on active duty for over 26 years in a variety of tactical, operational and strategic-level assignments that included deployments to Panama, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Iraq and Afghanistan.

He is the recipient of the Army Bronze Star, as well as numerous other DOD and Military Service Awards.
